Position Summary

The Lead Electric Lineworker oversees the construction and maintenance of the electric distribution system of Columbus Water & Light, the City of Columbus's municipally electric utility. This is a working position and is responsible for daily operations, work scheduling and line crew leadership. The Lead Electric Lineworker reports to the Utilities Director.

Responsibilities include:

As the Lead Electric Lineworker of the Columbus Water & Light team, they have primary responsibility for all aspects of daily electric utility operations and line crew leadership. This is a working Lineworker position with a 30 minute response time to Columbus Water & Light and required standby time.
